

Words into Action

Therefore, I say to you, the kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to a people that will produce its fruit. Matthew 21:43

Jesus uses some rather violent images in this parable to make a fundamental point about Christianity. He tells us that if you expect to be a "tenant" in the kingdom of God, you are going to have to work at it and bear fruit.

This parable underlines the importance of our responsibilities to participate in God's kingdom here on earth. We are called to love God and our neighbor. We are to become models of Jesus' love and mercy. We need to seek his forgiveness and offer it to those who have harmed us. Jesus' message is not simply words on a page.
