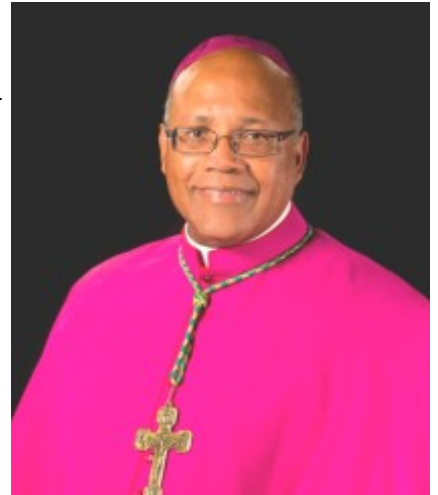
## IN OTHER NEWS
