What to do in Adoration?

Sometimes we can be intimidated to go to Adoration. It is not because we fear being with Jesus in prayer but rather we have never been taught what to do in an extended period of prayer. Is it alright to read, pray a rosary, or reflect upon the Scriptures? Or do I have to sit there- not moving or making a sound, staring at a gold monstrance with a Host inside?

While visiting our Lord in Eucharistic Adoration, we can pray in a variety of different ways.

Here are some suggestions:

1. Pray the Psalms or the Liturgy of the Hours
2. Recite the "Jesus Prayer;" Say: "Lord Jesus Christ, have mercy on me, a sinner."
3. Meditate using Scripture. Read the words and ask God to let the passage speak to you.
4. Read the life of a saint and pray with him or her.
5. Pour out your heart to Christ and adore Him.
6. Ask for forgiveness and intercede for others.
7. Pray the rosary.
8. Sit quietly and just "be" in the presence of God. Sit quietly and enjoy being in each other's company. Instead of talking to the Lord, try listening to what He wants to tell you.
