What Love Really Is

Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Love is patient, love is kind. - 1 Corinthians 13:4

This passage from first Corinthians, so popular as a reading for weddings, can easily be passed over as just another sentimental expression of the word "love." But when read slowly and thoughtfully, St. Paul's description of what love is and is not reveals a harder edge than most contemporary uses of the word.

The kind of love Paul describes is not easy to come by, much less display day in and day out. Like its partners of faith and hope, love must be renewed in us continually, not by force of will or fervent study or bold actions, but by the grace of God.

Paul wants us to see what love really is, not so we can grasp and possess it, but so that we can recognize, strive after and appreciate it when it shows up in our lives.

Lord Jesus, help me to love as you love us all.
