IMPORTANT NOTICE

I thank all those who attended the training we had last Sunday at St. Mary's Catholic Church, Camden. I appreciate all your sacrifices.

For all those who were not able to attend, we have some copies of the training handouts at the narrhex for different ministries. Please, pick only one copy that concerns your particular ministry and study it.

If you have any question, don't hesitate to call on me for some clarifications. Thanks and remain blessed.

Here are some few changes we need to implement regarding the training we had for various ministries. The implementation will begin officially on **Sunday**, **November 10**, **2019**. They are:

FOR EXTRA-ORDINARY MINISTERS OF THE EUCHARIST

- 1. For the reception of Holy Communion, Music Ministers to receive first followed by Persons with disabilities before the Congregation.
- 2. Precious Blood ministers will receive both the Chalice and Purificator before consuming from the chalice.
- 3. Don't dip Purificator inside the chalice during or after distribution of the precious blood.

FOR LECTORS

Five (5) minutes before mass begins, the Lector should walk to the ambo:

- 1. Welcome everyone to St. Mary's Catholic Church or Holy Family Mission Church, and ask that all please silence their cell phones.
- 2. Read the upcoming announcements.
- 3. Return to the back of the church for procession.
- 4. At the conclusion of Mass, the Lector may join the procession.
- 5. In the absence of a deacon, a lector may carry the **Book of the Gospels** (but not the Lectionary) during the entrance procession in a slightly elevated manner (**GIRM**, 194).
- 6. When no deacon is present, a lector may announce the intentions of the universal prayer from the ambo (GIRM, 197).

FOR USHERS

• Ushers welcome mass attendees and inform the Priest on time of the presence of any visitor to be recognized at the end of the mass.

FOR ALTAR SERVERS

- 1. When the offertory collection begins, place the Roman Missal and its stand on the left-side of Altar *(left when facing congregation).*
- 2. Place the Chalice and other Vessels in a neatly spaced row on the right-side of the Altar *(right when facing congregation).*
