All she wanted were the leftovers. This poor woman appeals to Jesus' mercy to heal her daughter. She

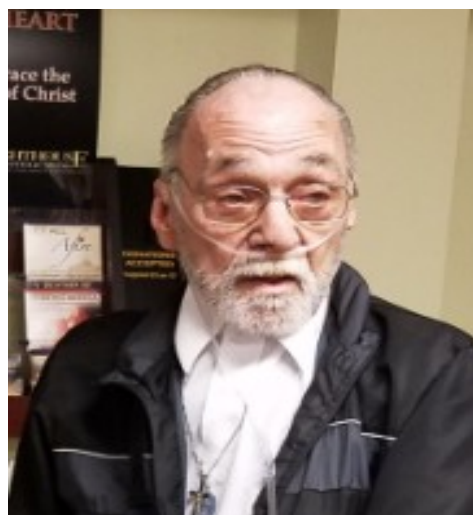
humbles herself and asks Jesus to do whatever he can to help. Her faith moves Jesus to act.
