"The One Thing Is Three" is a study on how the Trinity is important in our religion and lives. This class will also include video presentations by Fr. Michael E. Gaitley.

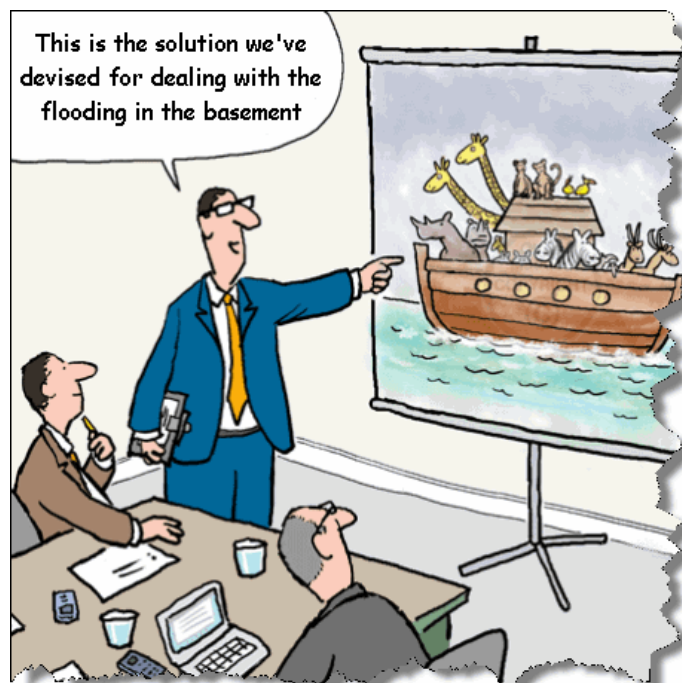
