THE SECRETS OF JESUS

On September 13, 1896, Sister Marie of the Sacred Heart (St. Thérèse's sister), wrote to Sister Thérèse asking her for a short note that expressed the secrets of her heart—the secrets God had confided to her. "The secrets of Jesus to Thérèse are sweet, and I would like to hear about them once again." That night, Sister Thérèse wrote a beautiful note to Sister Marie and included a reflection she had written five days earlier, September 8, the day after Sister Thérèse had begun a ten-day retreat.

This letter and her enclosed reflection make up the last chapter of the Story of a Soul. Upon reading these pages, Sister Marie wrote back to Sister Thérèse expressing her gratitude and awe.

"Oh! I wanted to cry when I read these lines that are not from earth but an echo from the Heart of God...Do you want me to tell you? Well, you are possessed by God, but what is called...absolutely possessed, just as the wicked are possessed by the devil."

Sister Marie went on to say, "I would like to be possessed, too, by good Jesus. However, I love you so

much that I rejoice when seeing you are more privileged than I am." Upon reading these words, Sister Thérèse wrote back to her sister.

"...I am sure that God would not give you the desire to be possessed by Him, by His Merciful Love if He were not reserving this favor for you...or rather He has already given it to you, since you have given yourself to Him, since you desire to be consumed by Him, and since God never gives desires that He cannot realize..."

The love shared by these two sisters was quite profound. They each deeply desired that the other know Jesus and allow herself to be deeply loved by Him, consumed by Him and possessed by Him. Each sister desired it more for the other than for herself.

They admired each other, encouraged each other, shared their hearts with each other and were deeply united with each other. Their love for each other was only possible as a result of their shared love for and union with Jesus.

ST. MARY:

St. Mary Church in Camden, TN began in 1948 when Bishop William Adrian was asked to offer Mass for a few families in Bruceton, TN. As the parish family grew, Mass was held in the Dixie Theater, in Camden.

The current church was dedicated in 1950 by the Most Reverend Bishop William Adrian. The present church cost \$28,000. In 1971, St. Mary became a mission of Holy Cross in Paris, TN when the Diocese of Memphis was formed. St. Mary became an independent parish in January 1981. In 2014, the church was renovated with a new interior and exterior, including stained glass windows.

HOLY FAMILY:

The first Mass of the Carroll County Catholic Mission was held on November 27, 1989 at the home of Mark Ramsey. Masses continued at various locations until October 1992, when The New Life First Assembly of God Church was put up for sale. The church and rectory, consisting of four acres, were purchased for \$135,000. Holy Family Catholic Church was the name chosen by its parishioners and celebrated its first Liturgy on June 3, 1993. On its fourth anniversary, November 27, 1993, Holy Family was formally dedicated with Bishop J. Terry Steib presiding. Father Joseph Paolozzi was the residing Pastor and traveled back and forth between Holy Family in Huntingdon and St. Mary in Camden.
