COMFORT FROM THE PSALMS DURING TRIALS

Nothing can be more comforting than the presence of Christ in our lives at any time, but knowing that He is there with us as we undergo trials is especially appreciated. Many find comfort in reading the teachings of our Lord from the Gospels and from the Epistles of the holy Apostles, while others also find comfort in reading and meditating on the Psalms.

The Psalms come to us from the Hebrew and Aramaic speaking nation of Israel, primarily from the time of King David. As most Catholics know, David was a Psalmist and many of the Psalms in our Bible are attributed to him. Many people in various circumstances have found solace and a sense of peace by meditating on verses from the Book of Psalms. One such person was a French Catholic gentleman named Frederic Ozanam (April 23, 1813-September 8, 1853; beatified by Pope John Paul II in 1917). In speaking to a friend, Blessed Ozanam, stated how he was moved by the Psalms and how

comforting it was to call upon the “Son of David.”

Blessed Ozanam said, “The hand of God has touched me, I believe, as it touched Job, Ezechias, and Tobias, not unto death, but unto a prolonged trial. I have not, unfortunately, the patience of these just men; I am easily cast down by suffering, and I should be inconsolable for my weakness if I did not find in the Psalms those cries of sorrow which David sends forth to God, and which God at last answers by sending him pardon and peace.

...During many weeks of extreme languor the Psalms have never been out of my hands. I am never tired of reading over and over those sublime lamentations, those flights of hope, those supplications full of love, which answer to all the wants and all the miseries of human nature.

It is nearly three thousand years since a king composed these songs in his days of repentance

and desolation, and we still find in them the expression of our deepest anguish and the consolation of our sorrows.

The priest recites them daily ; thousands of monasteries have been founded in order that these Psalms might be chanted at every hour, and that this voice of supplication might never be silent. The Gospel alone is superior to the hymns of David, and this only because it is their fulfillment—because all the yearnings, all the ardors, all the holy impatience of the prophet find their accomplishment in the Redeemer issued of his race.

So great is the bond between the two Testament that the Redeemer himself had no name dearer to him than that ‘Son of David.’ The two blind men of Jericho called him by it, and He had shortly before mentioned St. Paul, as an instance like that of David. I often cry out to him with them, ‘Son of David, have mercy on us.’”

Like Blessed Ozanam and so many others, when facing trials, dealing with pain, loss or loneliness, may we too find comfort from the words of the Psalms.
