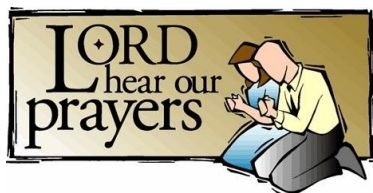
Friendly Reminders

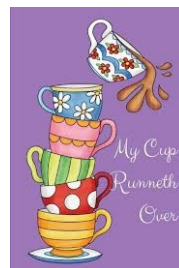
PLEASE Wear Your Face Mask Until Further Notice!
