RESTING IN OUR LORD'S ARMS-PART 4

If we are trusting Jesus in all things, then we will develop a sense of humility and surrender in our lives. When we recognize our own limitations and weaknesses, we can turn to God for strength and guidance, trusting that He will lead us on the right path.

St. James says, "Be humbled in the sight of the Lord, and he will exalt you." (Epistle of St. James 4:10) .

When we rest in God's Will, we surrender our own agendas and desires and seek to align ourselves with what our Lord wants for us. This can be a challenging and sometimes painful process, as we let go of our own desires and plans and seek to follow the Holy Spirit's leading. 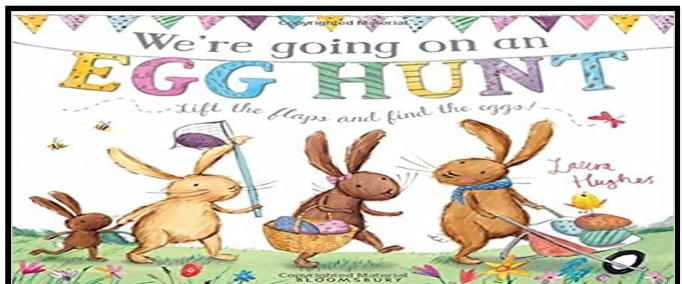
