WAYS TO GROW IN OUR FAITH

Serving others: Volunteering our time and resources to serve others is an important way to live out our faith and deepen our relationship with our Heavenly Father. We should always be looking for opportunities to volunteer at our parish or in the community, or consider joining a service-oriented organization.

Developing relationships with other parishioners: Surrounding yourself with other parish members can often provide encouragement, accountability, and support as you grow in faith. Join a small group Bible study, attend church events and activities, or simply reach out to others in the parish.

Always remember that growing in the faith is a journey, and it is important to be patient and persistent. You can ask the Blessed Virgin Mary to help you in this regard. May each of us make a serious commitment to regularly engage in practices that help us connect with God and deepen our understanding of the "most holy faith" (Jude 1:20).
