PASTOR'S EASTER MESSAGE—GOD IS GOOD! ALL THE TIME!

My beloved people of God, I thank the Almighty God for giving us another opportunity to celebrate this year, God's tremendous love for us. In our unworthiness, God the Father sent his Son to save the fallen humanity. This started when the **WORD** took **FLESH** in the womb of the **Blessed Virgin Mary** and then dwelt among us. However, the expression of this **Divine Love** reached its summit in the events of the **Paschal Triduum**—the Passion, Death, and Resurrection of Our Lord Jesus Christ, hence, the great **Easter story**.

On **Good Friday** was the story of betrayal and lies, conspiracy and injustice, unfaithfulness and wicked violence directed against an innocent and apparently helpless victim. Jesus was scourged, mocked, led on the death march by those he loved. He was nailed to the Cross where he died after a few hours and hastily buried in a tomb. Brothers and sisters, we ought to rejoice **always in the Lord** even when we are going through very difficult times. When the enemy seems to be winning the battle in our lives, never give up, because our faith in Christ has been vindicated. It is good news to know that **Truth is immortal.** We can suppress Truth, accuse it of being a lie, condemn it, torture it, kill it, and bury it in the grave but on the third day **Truth will rise again.** Remember this and do not give up on Truth even when everybody seems to give up on it. Do not give up on **Justice.** Do not give up on doing what is right.

Do not give up on God no matter your situation. We must learn to believe in the sun even when it is not shining; knowing that by and by it will shine again. Today **Christ has won.** And we know that in Christ we shall overcome. Thank you for your prayers and gifts. Remain ever blessed.


