CHRIST'S LOVE THROUGH THE SACRED HEART

“Come to me, all you who labor, and are burdened, and I will refresh you. Take up my yoke upon you, and learn of me, because I am meek, and humble of heart: and you shall find rest to your souls. For my yoke is sweet and my burden light.” (St. Matthew 18:28-30)

The infinite love that Jesus Christ has for each one of us is symbolized by His Sacred Heart. The heart is universally recognized as the center of love, and in the Sacred Heart of Jesus, we find perfect embodiment of divine love. The Sacred Heart of Jesus is the perfect manifestation of God's divine love. God sent His Son, Jesus Christ, to be amongst us, to live with us, to die for us, and to rise again, all out of love. This love is not a distant, abstract or poetic concept but a living, active reality that urges each of us to love one another.

No matter how far we stray, no matter how lost we feel, Jesus is always there, searching, ready to carry us back to safety.

The Sacred Heart of Jesus invites us to ponder the depth of His love. It is a love that seeks us out, heals us, rejoices in our return. It is a love that is patient, kind, and merciful. It is a love that understands our weaknesses and still calls us His own. In our daily lives, all of us encounter difficulties, pains, and sins that make us feel unworthy of such love. We may feel lost, abandoned, or even rejected. However, the Sacred Heart of Jesus reminds us that we are never alone, never abandoned. His heart is always open, always ready to embrace us. (Rev. Fr.
