UNITY IN THE PRECIOUS BLOOD OF CHRIST

"But now in Christ Jesus, you, who some time were afar off, are made nigh by the blood of Christ. For he is our peace, who hath made both one, and breaking down the middle wall of partition, the enmities in his flesh... and might reconcile both to God in one body by the cross, killing the enmities in himself. And coming, he preached peace to you that were afar off, and peace to them that were nigh. For by him we have access both in one Spirit to the Father." (Ephesians 2:13-18)

In this reading we can see how the heart of the Christian faith and the deep transformation brought about by our Lord Jesus Christ is revealed. St. Paul begins by reminding us of our former state. We were once distant from God, estranged by sin and separated by the chasm that sin creates. Yet, through the Precious Blood of Christ, we are brought near. This closeness is not by our merit but by His sacrifice.

St. Paul says, "For he is our peace, who hath made both one, and breaking down the middle wall of partition, the enmities in his flesh." Our Lord Himself is our peace. In a world rife with division and chaos, Christ unites us. He has torn down the barriers that divide, reconciling us to God and to one another. This is a peace that only Christ can give. Through His death on the Cross, Christ has reconciled us to the Father. The enmities, the hostilities, and the divisions are put to death in His flesh. We are now one body, united in the sacrifice of our Saviour.

The message of peace is universal. The Gospel transcends all boundaries, offering peace to all who will receive it. Through Christ, we are granted access to the Father. This access is not limited but is given to all believers through the Holy Spirit. We are no longer strangers or foreigners but are fellow citizens with the saints and members of God's household.

May each of us embrace this unity and peace that Christ has won for us. Let us live as one body, united in faith and love, and may we continually give thanks for the grace and peace we have received through our Lord Jesus Christ.
