THE MOST PRECIOUS BLOOD OF OUR SAVIOR JESUS CHRIST

As we gather for each Mass throughout this month, let us remember that the month of July is dedicated to the Most Precious Blood of Our Savior Jesus Christ. We are invited to deeply contemplate and venerate the Most Precious Blood. This devotion, rich in significance and history, offers us deep insights into the mystery of our redemption, and the boundless love of God. The Precious Blood of Jesus, shed during His Passion, is a testament to the infinite mercy and love of God for mankind. It is through this Blood that we have been redeemed, and it is through this Blood that the covenant between God and humanity has been sealed. In the Old Testament, the blood of sacrificial animals was used to atone for sins, symbolizing purification and reconciliation with God. However, these sacrifices were a foreshadowing of the ultimate sacrifice to come—the sacrifice of Jesus, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sins of the world.

As our Lord was scourged at the pillar, the Precious Blood flowed from His sacred wounds, inflicted by the cruel lashes. Each drop of blood was a testament to His love and a means of our purification. “He was wounded for our iniquities, he was bruised for our sins: the chastisement of our peace was upon him, and by his bruises we are healed.” (Isaiah 53:5) The scourging at the pillar should remind us of the gravity of our sins and the immense price paid for our redemption. It calls us to true contrition and a firm resolution to amend our lives.

At Calvary, the climax of His Passion, our Lord was nailed to the Cross, and His Precious Blood poured forth from His hands and feet. The Crucifixion is the ultimate sacrifice, where Jesus, the spotless Lamb, offered Himself for the salvation of the world. The devotion to the Most Precious Blood calls us to reflect on the immense love of God, who did not spare His own Son but delivered Him up for us all (Romans 8:32). It invites us to a deeper appreciation of the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, where the same Precious Blood of Christ is made present on the altar. Each Mass is a renewal of the sacrifice of Calvary, and we are called to participate with the reverence, gratitude, and love.

The month of July is a time of grace and reflection. May each of us draw near to the Sacred Heart of Jesus, which was pierced for our salvation, and allow His Precious Blood to cleanse, heal, and sanctify us. May this devotion deepen our love for Christ, strengthen our faith, and inspire us to live lives worthy of the great price paid for our redemption. Through the intercession of Our Lady of the Precious Blood, may we grow in holiness and be ever more conformed to the image of her Divine Son.
