THE POWER OF CHRIST'S WORD

The Gospel of St. Mark 7:31-37 presents to us a wonderful account of the healing power of our Lord Jesus Christ. We see Him traveling through the region of Decapolis, where He encounters a man who is deaf and mute. Those who bring the man to Jesus beseech Him to lay His hand upon him, demonstrating their faith in His divine power. Our Lord's response to this plea is both intimate and compassionate. He takes the man aside, away from the crowd, and looking up to heaven, He groans and says, "Ephpheta," which means "Be thou opened." Immediately, the man's ears are opened, his tongue is loosed, and he begins to speak plainly.

When Jesus looks up to heaven and groans, He demonstrates His unity with the Father and His deep compassion for human suffering. The word "Ephpheta" is a command that reveals Christ's authority over all creation. With this single word, He opens the man's ears and frees his tongue, restoring his ability to hear and speak. This miraculous healing is not just a physical restoration, but also a sign of the spiritual renewal that Christ brings to all who come to Him in faith.

The reaction of the people is one of amazement and praise: "He hath done all things well. He hath made both the deaf to hear and the dumb to speak." This echoes the words from the Book of Genesis, where God saw all that He had made and declared it very good. Jesus, the Word made flesh, continues this divine work of re-creation, bringing wholeness and redemption to a fallen world.

Today's Gospel passage also calls us to reflect on our own spiritual deafness and muteness. How often do we close our ears to the Word of God or fail to proclaim His truth with our tongues? We are reminded that we need the healing touch of Christ to open our ears to His voice and to loosen our tongues to speak His praises. The Sacrament of Confession is a means by which we can receive this healing grace, restoring us to spiritual health and enabling us to live our faith more fully.

May each of us approach our Lord with the same faith and trust as those who brought the deaf and mute man to Him. Let us ask Him to open our ears to His Word and to free our tongues to proclaim His goodness. And let us give thanks for the great mercy He shows us, healing our infirmities and making us whole.
