PREPARING FOR LENT

Lent is one of the most sacred seasons in the Catholic Church, a time for penance, reflection, and spiritual renewal. As we approach this solemn period, it is essential to prepare ourselves both spiritually and practically. The Church invites us to reflect on our lives, identify areas for improvement, and draw closer to Christ through prayers, fasting, and alms-giving. This can involve donating time, resources, or money to those in need, particularly to those who suffer from material poverty, but also to those in spiritual need. Alms-giving is an outward expression of love that mirrors the selfless love Christ demonstrated on the Cross. It also provides an opportunity to practice humility and gratitude for the blessings we have received. By preparing for Lent in this way, we open our hearts to a season of wholehearted transformation, with the ultimate goal of growing closer to Christ and becoming more fully the people He calls us to be.
