The presence of God is not confined to sacred buildings or extraordinary visions. The Bile teaches us that the Lord is not distant from His creation. In Psalm 139:7-10., we read: "Where can I go from your Spirit? Or where can I flee from your presence? I I ascend to heaven, you are there; if I make my bed in Sheol, you are there." God's presence encompasses all things. He is not a God who watches from afar, but One who upholds the universe and is present in every breath of life. This truth should shape the way we live, especially in a world that forgets Him.

God's presence is most fully revealed to us in the Incarnation of our Lord Jesus Christ. As the Apostle John wrote, "And the Word became flesh and lived among us." (John 1:14) Christ did not remain in glory apart from us but humbles Himself to dwell among sinners. This was the full revelation of God's will to unite Himself with Man. Even after His Ascension, He did not leave us orphaned. Through the descent of the Holy Spirit, He abides with us still. The Holy Mysteries of the Church are not symbolic acts but the real presence of God among His people.

The presence of God is also made known in our conscience. When we sin, it is not simply a violation of law but an offence against a person. As the Prophet Nathan said to David, "You are the Man!" (2 Samuel 12:7). That encounter was the living God confronting the sinner. God does not abandon us in our filth. Instead, He calls us to repentance and offers mercy. The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom (Proverbs 9:10) because it awakens us to His presence. No Christian ever lives as though God were absent. To do so is to fall into delusion and destruction.

We do not conjure God's presence through emotion or noise. He is not a spectacle. Elijah discovered this when the Lord was not in the wind, earthquake, or fire but in the sound of sheer silence. (1Kings 19:12) The true Christian seeks silence and stillness because God is present there. But silence does not mean God is far off-it is the silence of awe before His nearness. The Holy Church preserves this truth in her ascetic life, in her reverent prayer, and in Her Holy Icons, which are windows to the presence of the Incarnate Word. Let every soul be vigilant, for the Lord is near. Let us walk in His presence with fear, obedience, and hope.


