A LOVE EVERLASTING


As we mentioned in last week's bulletin, the month of June is hallowed in Catholic tradition as the time especially devoted to the Most Sacred Heart of our Lord Jesus Christ. This devotion is not just a sentimental thought, but theologically rich, calling the faithful to contemplate the divine charity that burns perpetually within the Heart of the Incarnate Word. That Sacred Heart, once pierced upon the Cross, is the inexhaustible wellspring of mercy, love, and sanctifying grace. As the Lord Himself declared, "I have loved thee with an everlasting love, therefore have I drawn thee, taking pity on thee" (Jeremias 31:3). To venerate the Sacred Heart is to approach the very core of the mystery of Redemption.

This holy devotion was most notably propagated through the visions granted to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque in the seventeenth century. In these sacred revelations, Christ presented His Heart aflame, crowned with thorns, and surmounted by the Cross-a sign of His sorrow over the ingratitude of souls. He lamented the coldness shown to Him, particularly in the Blessed sacrament, and requested acts of reparation. "And they shall look upon me, whom they have pierced" (Zacharias 12:10). The Church responded by instituting the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart and urging all the faithful to renew their love for Christ, especially through acts pf Penance, adoration, and Eucharistic devotion.

The Sacred Heart is intimately bound to the Holy Eucharist, wherein the very Heart that was opened by the spear is daily made present upon the altar. The tabernacle thus becomes not a symbol alone, but the living sanctuary of the Divine Heart. To receive Holy Communion devoutly is to enter into union with the One who is "Meek and humble of heart" (Matthew 11:29). Through such union, the soul is shaped and softened by the gentleness of the Saviour, and the harshness of sin is gradually worn away. The Sacred Heart calls each soul not only to veneration but to imitation-particularly in mercy, humility, and enduring love.

Let the faithful therefore dedicate this month to acts of homage and reparation. Let homes be consecrated to the Sacred Heart, and families united in daily prayer and the recitation of the Litany of the Sacred Heart. Through such devotion, the faithful enter into deeper communion with Christ, who said, "But one of the soldiers with a spear opened his side, and immediately there came out blood and water" (John 19:34). That wound remains forever open-inviting, cleansing, and sanctifying. In the Sacred Heart is found the surest refuge from sin, the strongest assurance of salvation, and the eternal love of the Divine Redeemer.
