#### **HUMILITY IN THE PRESENCE OF GOD**

In the parable we read in Luke 18:9-14, our Lord gives us a tender but searching lesson on the nature of true prayer and justification. Two men went up to the temple, one a Pharisee, outwardly religious, and the other a publican, despised as a sinner. Both addressed their words to God, but the spirit of their prayer could have not been more different. The Pharisee's words were filled with pride, rehearsing his own achievements and looking down upon his neighbor. The publican, by contrast, could only raise a cry from a humbles heart: "Oh God, be merciful to me, a sinner."

The Pharisee represents the danger of trusting in ourselves. His prayer was not truly a prayer, but a monologue with his own ego, for he "prayed thus with himself." How often are we tempted to measure our worth by our own works, to imagine ourselves superior to others, or to reduce religion to a record of personal accomplishments? Our Lord shows us that such a path leads not to communion with God, but to self-deception. True righteousness does not begin with comparing ourselves to others, but with standing honestly before God in humility.

The publican stands before us as the model of prayer. He remains at a distance, not daring to lift his eyes, but striking his breast as he utters the words of repentance. In this posture we recognize the very spirit of the Church's prayer—"Lord, have mercy." Such a cry is never rejected. God draws near to the contrite, for "a contrite and humbled heart, O God, thou wilt not despise" (Psalm 50:19). The simplicity of the publican's prayer reveals what God desires most, not long speeches, nor self-justification, but the offering of a humble heart open to His mercy.

Christ concludes with the great reversal. "Every one that exalteth himself shall be humbled, and he that humbleth himself shall be exalted." Here is both warning and consolation. Pride shuts the door to grace, but humility opens it wide. The publican returned home justified because he entrusted himself to God's mercy rather than to his own merit. So too must we approach the Lord in prayer—not boasting of our strength, but acknowledging our weakness, not despising others, but embracing them in compassion. In this way, we also shall be lifted up, not by our own hands, but by the mercy of God who delights to exalt the humble.
