KEEPING CHRISTMAS IN OUR HEARTS

The Feast of the Nativity does not conclude when the decorations are taken down or when the calendar turns its page. Christmas is not a single day confined to sentiment or custom; it is the enduring mystery of the Word made flesh dwelling amongst us. Saint Joh wrote, "The Word made flesh, and dwelt amongst us" (John 1:14). This divine condescension is not an event that fades with time, but a living reality that must be guarded within the heart of the faithful. To keep Christmas is to keep Christ Himself, not as a memory, but as a present Lord who abides with His people.

The Gospel teaches us that Mary "kept all these words, pondering them in her heart" (Luke 2:19). In her, the Church is given a model of hoe Christmas is preserved beyond the manger scene. She did not cling to the external signs alone-the angels, the shepherds, the wonders-but carried the mystery inward, allowing it to shape her entire life. So too, we are called to interior fidelity. The child laid in the crib must also be enthroned with in the soul, where humility, obedience, and quiet trust can take root and bear fruit in daily life.

Saint Paul reminds us that "the grace of God our Savior hath appeared to all men, instructing us, that, denying ungodliness and worldly desires, we should live soberly, and justly, and godly in this world" (Titus 2:11-12). Christmas grace instructs and disciplines the heart. To keep Christmas is to allow the light of Bethlehem to expose what does not belong to Christ within us, and to commit ourselves anew to charity, patience, and fidelity. The Holy Cihld who comes in poverty calls us to simplicity; the Prince of Peace calls us to reconciliation; the Light of the world calls us to walk as children of light.

Our Lord assures us, "Behold, I am with you all days, even tot he consummation of the world" (Matthew 28:20). Christmas, therefore, is sustained wherever Christ is welcomed, obeyed, and loved. Each Eucharist renews the mystery of Emmanuel-God with us-not in symbol only, but in truth. As we move duties, our trials, and our acts of mercy, so that the joy announced to the shepherd may continue to echo in our lives, and the world may still hold the light in the darkness.
